

### GENERAL

- plan new plantings; draw a to-scale sketch of your yard, including trees & shrubs (when bulbs & perennials emerge in spring, add them to the sketch) to determine placement & space for new plants
- water outdoor container gardens when weather is mild & pots have thawed

# vegetables & herbs

- start seeds indoors for broccoli, cabbage, Chinese cabbage, parsley, onions & leeks
- buy seeds early for best selection

#### FRUIT

twist off Eastern Tent Caterpillar egg cases from apple, cherry & crabapple trees

### WILDLIFE

- keep bird feeders clean & replenished
- keep bird baths clean & filled with unfrozen water
- if you have a pond, make sure a portion of it is clear of ice at all times

### BULBS

- if bulbs start emerging early, cover with a plastic trash can at night to keep frost off
- ☐ label bulbs as they emerge so you know where they are after they go dormant

## SHRUBS & TREES

- prune deciduous (leaf-dropping) trees to remove dead or broken branches & branches that rub against each other & to improve form (just be conservative when pruning spring bloomers so you don't remove too many flower buds)
- if you've had problems with aphids, mites, woolly adelgid or scale insects, spray trees with dormant oil following label instructions when temperatures will remain above 40°F for 24 hours after spraying
- remove & destroy bagworm bags from affected trees, principally evergreens
- if deer are a problem, apply deer repellants monthly, rotating two or more products

# ANNUALS & PERENNIALS

plant pansies & cool-season vegetables at the end of the month if weather is forecast to be mild for next 10 days

#### HOUSEPLANTS

- check plants for pests (scale, mealybugs, spider mites) & treat as needed
- ☐ let soil dry to touch between waterings
