GENERAL

- pick up sticks
- clean up leaves and debris

vegetables & herbs

- add yearly amendments to soil
- put up trellises and teepees for climbing vegetables
- start vegetable seeds indoors, under lights
 - -- early March: broccolli and cabbage (ready in 6-8 weeks), spinach, lettuce, kale, mustard and other greens (ready in 2-3 weeks)
 - -- late March: eggplant and pepper (ready in 6-8 weeks)
- plant early vegetables outdoors as soon as soil is workable
 - -- potatoes, onion sets, leeks, peas
 - -- beets, bok choy, kale, mustard, turnips

FRUIT

- prune small fruits, such as brambles, through bloom period
- routine prune apple and pear trees (wait to prune peach trees until after flowering)
- apply a balanced fertilizer to peach trees

shrubs & trees

- prune (wait until after early flowering shrubs and trees have finished blooming)
- remove and destroy any egg masses (bagworms or Eastern tent caterpillar)
- if there are signs of spider mites, apply an ultra-fine horticultural oil spray
- if there was a problem with scale insects last year, spray a dormant oil before bud swell

ANNUALS & PERENNIALS

- plant pansies, dianthus and snapdragons
- cut back ornamental grasses and the stems of last year's perennials
- clean debris from the tops of groundcovers and short perennials
- divide some perennials (like hostas) as they poke out of the ground
- start seeds of ornamental annuals indoors (ready in 5-6 weeks)

LAWN

- seed your lawn to cover thin or bare spots (if you didn't last fall)
- apply herbicides (be aware that some should not coincide with lawn seed application -- when in doubt, ask)
 - -- for crabgrass, apply pre-emergent herbicide in mid-March
 - -- for broadleaf weeds, apply broadleaf herbicide in late March or throughout April
- sharpen lawnmower blades

INDOOR PLANTS

- begin repotting and dividing houseplants
- as new growth appears, resume fertilizing
- gradually increase watering

WILDLIFE

- empty bird boxes
- put up birdhouses
 - apply deer repellents as perennials begin to grow
